

Meeting held on 8th October 2014

14/143	The meeting was opened at 19:00 hours.
14/144	Notice of Meeting Resolved: That Public Notice of the meeting had been given in accordance with Schedule 12 Para 10 (2) (b) of the Local Government Act 1972.
14/145	Apologies Apology was received from Cllr G Allanson.
14/146	Declarations of Interest No declarations of interest were made.
14/147	Police Report A written report was received. The Police referred to the report with nothing further to highlight. Changes in Police personnel were highlighted for information. A councillor commented that incidents had occurred which do not appear on the monthly report.
14/148	Public Comments No issues were raised.
14/149	Report from County Councillor Cllr Blackburn provided an update on grass cutting and confirmed that maps would be distributed shortly to parish councils for consultation. He also confirmed that he had flagged up the adverse impact this would have on parish precepts. He advised that he had shown the area manager around the village and discussed various issues of local concern with him. He is following up the Cocoa Field Tree issues, and the sign post on Mill Hill. The “no exit” at the pet store was discussed and the chair agreed to discuss it with the owner.
14/150	Report from Borough Councillor The SBC element of finance for grass cutting was expected to remain the same.

Concerns were raised by residents and councillors at SBC proposals to levy charges for the emptying of Brown Bins. Cllr M Donoghue-Moncrief confirmed that she was unhappy with these proposals.

Fly-Grazing on the A165 verges was discussed, complaints have been made to high level police management on their direction on dealing with the problem.

The cost of grass cutting was a cause of concern following NYCC decision to cease this activity with funding issues relating to SBC and parish councils being discussed.

14/151 Minutes of the Previous Meeting

It was Resolved that the minutes of the meeting held on 10th September 2014 as circulated be approved and were signed by the chair.

14/152 Planning Applications

One planning application was received: 14/01898/HS application to demolish existing garage, single story extension and porch and erection of a two story side extension and new porch at, The Bungalow, West Street, Muston. Due to the late advice from SBC more time was required to review this application.

Consultation notice was received on proposed amendment of the official route of the Yorkshire Wolds Way. No objections were received.

It was understood that some trees at the Priory were to be cut down and enquires were to be made with SBC to obtain the facts.

14/153 Village Green Amenities

Following the public meeting held on 10th September 2014 a survey of residents was to be undertaken to determine what residents wanted. The format of the questionnaire was discussed and agreed.

14/154 Future Funding for Grass Cutting

Further details were awaited from NYCC.

14/155 Village Issues

Street Lights – No issues were raised.

War Memorial – this item was deferred until the next meeting.

Trees on King Hall – Planning permission to cut back the trees has been given. A quote for £300 to undertake the work has been received and was approved. It was noted that further work would be required to balance the trees, SBC were to be contacted to see if the existing permission will allow this.

Village Pond – It was agreed that a contractor was to be instructed to clean out the pond and the rubbish removed from site. It was noted that the road may require cleaning afterwards. Cllr P Barker agreed to arrange.

Brown Bins – No decision has been made by SBC yet. A letter has been sent expressing the parish council's objections to this proposal.

Beck Cleaning – Weeds were blocking the beck requiring urgent action to prevent

flooding. It was agreed to get a contractor to undertake the required work. It was also noted that an iron pipe required cutting back. Cllr P Barker agreed to organise.

It was noted that the beck required cleaning from the bridge in Muston towards Folkton. The Drainage Board were to be contacted to have this worked undertaken.

14/156 Finance

The schedule of payments for October was circulated prior to the meeting. It was Resolved that the figure totalling £364.25 would be paid. Payments received: Filey Lions £300, SBC 2nd instalment of Precept £2350, SBC 2nd instalment of Model Agreement £1367.73 and NYCC for Grass Cutting £1655.15.

14/157 Reports

The police showed a video of driving incidents at the Road Liaison meeting. The procedures for obtaining a speed survey were also explained.

A CaP meeting recently contained a talk on Neighbourhood Watch scheme.

At a meeting of Filey Probus it was highlighted that free driving lessons for pensioners were being given.

A meeting of the YLCA was held on 6th October at which a number of issues were discussed.
