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| 16/106 | The meeting was opened at 19:30 hours. |
| 16/107 | Notice of Meeting
Resolved: That Public Notice of the meeting had been given in accordance with Schedule 12 Para 10 (2) (b) of the Local Government Act 1972. |
| 16/108 | Apologies
No apologies were received. |
| 16/109 | Declarations of Interest on Agenda Items
Cllrs G Allanson and G Barnett both declared an interest on correspondence relating to the Village Hall Committee planning bid. |
| 16/110 | Police Report
A written report was circulated. Cllr B Stevenson reported that the Police were investigating the hacking incident previously reported to the parish council by the clerk. |
| 16/111 | Public Comments
No issues were raised. |
| 16/112 | Report from County Councillor
The gullies have been clean out. The Chevrons on the A165 were to be repainted week commencing 18 th July 2016. |
| 16/113 | Report from Borough Councillors
A turnout of 78% occurred in this area for the E. U. referendum with the “leave” majority being a very high percentage. A £40million investment was expected at Irton Moor which was expected to lead to an increased demand for housing in the area. |

It was Resolved that the minutes of the meeting held on 8 th June 2016 as circulated be approved and were signed by the Chair. |
| 16/115 | Matters Arising |

(16/82) The Millennium Committee have agreed to pay for two additional grass cuts in addition to those already funding by them.

(16/99) Work on the Kissing Gate has been completed with the invoice expected shortly. Following discussion it was agreed to treat the gate and Cllr G Allanson agreed to arrange this.

(16/102) The privet hedge at Muston Hodge has been cut back.

16/116 Planning Applications

One planning application was received. 16/01010/LB application to alter the internal layout at West House Farm, West Street, Muston. Following discussion there were no objections to this application with the condition that the frontage remains the same and continues to be painted white.

16/117 Village Issues

Village Green Fencing – Work was almost complete with only the two lockable posts remaining to be installed.

2016 Garden Competition – Judging has been completed with the winners to be notified shortly. The prizes will be presented on 3rd September 2016. Cllr P Colling was thanked for organising this year's event.

Pets R Wright – The Police have provided details of the two traffic accidents that occurred during May.

Cleaning of War Memorial – Potential funding sources were being investigated. A meeting with an expert was to be arranged to discuss exactly what was required.

16/118 Finance

The schedule of payments for June was circulated prior to the meeting. It was Resolved that the figure totalling £1211.64 would be paid.

The invoices for the Kissing Gate and Village Green Fencing were both expected very shortly. It was agreed that the Clerk was to pay these invoices in advance of the next meeting in September to avoid delay.

Payments received: £600 from Millennium Committee for two grass cuts and the Garden Competition prizes.

16/119 Reports

Cllr G Allanson reported that the Village Hall Committee was applying for funding towards a new Village Hall. Following discussion it was agreed unanimously that the parish council would support their bid.

Cllr G Barnett reported that he had attended a CaP meeting on 6th July. There was a slight increase of 5 in reported crime from 21st April to 21st June totalling 45. The Hertford Ward has the lowest crime figures in the area. The next CaP meeting was scheduled for November.

Cllr B Stevenson reported that Mr C Day has cut the grass between the Pond and Identity.

16/120 Correspondence

An invitation was received from Hunmanby Parish Council for the Chair to attend the Civic service at Hunmanby on 24th July. Cllrs D Walker and J Walker agreed to attend to represent Muston.

A response was received from Yorkshire Coast Homes advising that they have spoken to the owner of the caravan and that there was nothing they could do.

A response has been received from NYCC conforming that the gate to the Wolds Way footpath has been sorted out.

Residents have expressed concern about speed traffic along Hunmanby Street. It was agreed to discuss this at the next meeting.

Problems have been experienced with parked cars at certain times near to the Pub.
